# Polk County Normal School 1904-1960/St. Croix Falls (SCF) 1960-1971/Frederic

In the fall of 1904, the Polk County
Board of Supervisors authorized the
establishment of a Polk County
Training School (for teachers). The
Comer Brothers donated the land, the
village of SCF contributed \$5,000.00 and
construction started in August 1905.
