State fair century farm applications available

Officials at Wisconsin State Fair announce that applications are now available for the 2012 Century and Sesquicentennial Farm and Home Award.

To qualify for the award, families are required to provide proof of continuous family ownership of a property in the state of Wisconsin for either the last 100 or 150 years. All property owners will be honored at a special Century and

Sesquicentennial Farm and Home Award program held on Tuesday, Aug. 7, in conjunction with the 2012 Wisconsin State Fair.

Honorees will receive complimentary fair admission tickets, an invitation to the awards breakfast and a commemorative photo, certificate and outdoor sign provided by Hillshire Farm, a longtime program sponsor.

The Century Farm and Home Program began in 1948 in conjunction with the state's Wisconsin's centennial celebration. There are currently 8, 583 century farms and homes nestled through the Badger State.

To request a copy of either application, write to either Farm and Home Program, 640 South 84th St., West Allis, WI 53214; or call Jill Albanese, program coordinator, at 414-777-0580. Applications are not available online.

The deadline for applications is March 1. Only one certificate is issued per property.

The Freedmen's Bureau

The Bureau of Refugees, Freedmen and Abandoned Lands ... often referred to as the Freedmen's Bureau was established in the War Department by an act of 3 March 1865. The Bureau supervised all relief and educational activities relating to refugees and freedmen; it issued food and clothing. operated hospitals and temporary camps, helped located family members, promoted education, helped freedmen legalize marriages, provided employment, supervised labor contracts, provided legal representation and investigated racial confrontations. The Bureau also assumed custody of confiscated lands or property in the former Confederate States, Border States, District of Columbia, Indian Territory and settled freedmen on those abandoned or confiscated lands. Bureau also worked with African American soldiers, sailors and their heirs to secure back pay, bounty payments and pensions. The bureau records were created or maintained by bureau

headquarters, the assistant commissioners and the state superintendents of education and included personnel records and a variety of standard reports concerning bureau programs and conditions in the states. Treasure Trove of Global Genealogical Records now Available in Wisconsin

The Collections of the Genealogical Society of Utah include records held around the globe. They include church and civil records, family and local histories, land and military records and other genealogical gems. The Wisconsin Historical Society's library and archives now make those records available to researcher here in Wisconsin. This service has just become easier to use.

Researchers now go to familysearch.org/films to place the order for their microfilm and select the Wisconsin Historical Society as the receiving Family History Center Affiliate. Also, the cost has come down to \$5.50 a reel and the short-term loan now goes to 90 days instead of 30 days.
