SENIOR CLASS HISTORY

On August 31, 1949 thirty-four enthusiastic Freshmen took their place in the W.H.S. student body. As was customary, the Sophomore Class gave us our official welcome on September 15 with the usual initiation festivities. On October 7, 1949 we returned their favor with a Freshman-Sophomore party. Class officers were elected and we were on our way to becoming intellects.

In the fall of 1950 we were officially accepted as Sophomores. We found our roll-call to be three students short. They were Jack Joswiak, Eleanor Draus, and Tony Zmuda. Later in our Sophomore year we welcomed into the fold Betty Novak and Mae Vetterkind.

Thus we became upper classmen in the year of 1951, our enrollment now being twenty-one students. Those absent from our class were Ray Oseicki, Felix Szleszinski, Orville Delano, Louis Mujwid, Wayne Noha, Marlin Johnson, Terry Mackey, Roxie Thomas, and Arlene Nelson. We were joined by Leonard Makuch.

Class officers were elected and the Junior year began. Important events during the year were the Junior Class play, "Willies' Weekend," presented November 2, and the Junior Prom (theme selected "Meet Me Tonight in Dreamland.") The reigning royalty were King, Dean Wutkiewicz; Queen, Elaine Thull; Prince, Leonard Makuch; and Princess, Mae Vetterkind.

On August 25, 1952 the Senior Class of 53 became official rulers of the W.H.S. The roll-call was short George Tomczak, but he joined us later in the year along with Roxie Thomas, making the number of Seniors twenty.

Things began happening very fast. On September 2 the long awaited class rings were received. Plans were made for class pictures to be taken September 17. Next in line were plans for the annual Homecoming festivities; the date was set for September 26, 1952. The Senior Class was represented by King, Leonard Makuch; attendents, Janet Preston and Jim Kendzior, Roxie Thomas and Marvin Noha, Gerry Daniels and Dean Wutkiewicz, in the grand march and parade.

We seniors were well represented when the selection of cheerleaders was due. Elected were Janet Preston and Roxie Thomas of the Senior class.


On December 2 our class was joined by Reuben Klimeck, formerly of Medford, Wisconsin.
