





Back to W. H. S. we trudged in the fall of 1952, finding ourselves to be sophisticated Juniors. At the beginning of the year Felix Szleszinski joined our class. We lost Carl Mortensen, but gained another member in Darrell Keller. This made an enrollment of thirty. The second successful event was our Junior Prom, held April 24. The minstrel show couldn't have been a success without Red Kazmierkoski, Bob Miller, and Calvin Kramer rendering their humorous services as "end men."

At long last August 31, 1953, rolled around, and we finally became mighty Seniors and "official dictators" of W. H. S. (Look out 2000) H. S. (Look out lower classmen!!) All of our classmates returned except Jeanne Michalski, Calvin Kramer, and Darrell Calkins. This reduced our enrollment to twenty-seven. The hustle and bustle of excitement began right from the very beginning. That long yearning for our class rings was finally satisfied when we received them during the first week of school. Our senior class pictures were taken at the Du Bois Studios in Ladysmith on September 16. (We never did find out how many cameras were incapacitated!!) This year our class was again represented on the Student Council. Donald Kolek, Arnold Checkalski, and Donald Ridout were the elected student-body representatives. Donald Kolek was Student Council president; Patricia Mujwid was Secretary. The annual staff, which was chosen the previous year by the faculty, began working on annual assignments. Plans and preparations were soon under way for the annual Homecoming Day festivities. (Our class had won prizes for our homecoming floats during each of the three previous years.) Bob Koehler three previous years.) Bob Koehler was King, and the senior attendants were Patsy Mujwid and Doug. Preston. The football team was well represented by many of our senior boys. We were very proud of their fine athletic abilities and sportsmanship this year as well as the previous years; they also proved to be fine athletes in basketball and track. Jean Wells, Patsy Mujwid, and Evelyn Romanowski were cheerleaders again this year.

Even though our four high school

years were very busy ones, they were also exciting and happy. We always will remember Weyerhauser High and will look back proudly at the wonderful times we have spent there.

We were initiated on a bleak, cold September day, but we showed the Sophomores that we could take it. We gave the return party on the night of October 14, 1953.


